



The TB case rate is:

per 100,000 people

TB cases reported in 2022

8, 331 cases of TB were reported in the U.S. in 2022

The national average is 2.5 per 100,000 people

TB IS PREVENTABLE & CURABLE.



TB is spread through the air from one person to another.

Symptoms of TB disease include: A Cough lasting longer than 3 weeks

Chest pain

Night sweats

> Weight loss



Fever

A typical person with TB disease in the United States requires:



- PLUS
- X-rays
- Lab tests
- Follow-up & testing of contacts
