# November 12 PHEP Connects Webinar Highlights Enhanced Information Exchange Using GIS Technology

CDC's next PHEP Connects webinar, "Building a United COVID-19 Response Using GIS Technology in Minnesota," is scheduled for **1 p.m. EST on Thursday, November 12**. Normally held on the second Wednesday of the month, the November webinar has been moved due to the Veterans Day federal holiday on November 11.



The PHEP Connects webinar will highlight how Minnesota used Geographic Information System (GIS) technology to quickly progress from being reactive to proactive in collecting and sharing information. Webinar presenters will describe how the state's simple maps and dashboards evolved into a collaborative environment designed to fulfill mounting information demands.

### **CDC Partnership Develops Campaign to Encourage Influenza Vaccination**

In collaboration with the American Medical Association and the Ad Council, CDC launched a flu vaccine educational <u>campaign</u> called No One Has Time for Flu. The campaign includes a toolkit with a fact sheet, social media messages, graphics, talking points, and other materials that are available in English and in Spanish for partners to use during the 2020-2021 cold and flu season. The campaign features TV, radio, and digital ads aiming to increase flu vaccination rates with emphasis on <u>non-Hispanic Black and Hispanic/Latino groups</u>, who are at higher risk of serious flu complications, but are less likely to be vaccinated. Getting a flu vaccine is more important than ever as it can flatten the curve of flu illnesses and help protect essential workers from flu. It can also conserve medical resources for care of patients with COVID-19.
