July 14 PHEP Connects Webinar Highlights Behavioral Health and Emergency Preparedness and Response



CDC's next PHEP Connects webinar, scheduled for 1:30 p.m. EDT*

on Wednesday, July 14, will discuss Michigan's lessons learned from emergency responses leading up to, and including, the COVID-19 pandemic. The webinar will focus on how involving state behavioral health staff throughout the COVID-19 disaster response enabled Michigan to appropriately address both the physical and mental health needs of its residents and to build their resilience. Debra A. Pinals, M.D., Medical Director for Behavioral Health and Forensic Programs for the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, will describe activities conducted by Michigan's disaster behavioral health team. This will include an overview of work with federal partners and public health to provide emotional support to all Michiganders during the pandemic, as well as initiatives to maximize continuity of operations and health equity for services to vulnerable populations. CDC Updates Guidance for COVID-19 Prevention in K-12 Schools

CDC has updated the <u>Guidance for COVID-19 Prevention in Kindergarten (K)-12 Schools</u>. This updated guidance focuses on helping administrators in K-12 schools, along with state and local health officials, safely support in-person learning as well as sports and other extracurricular activities. As many children are not yet eligible for COVID-19 vaccination, the updated guidance emphasizes the prevention strategies most important for in-person learning, regardless of whether schools can implement all the prevention strategies. The guidance also gives schools a flexible, science-based approach to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and to keep students, teachers, and staff healthy and in the classroom.

CDC encourages recipients to share this guidance widely with your partners and networks and on your organization's social media pages. The updates are based on the latest science in the updated CDC Science Brief: Transmission of SARS-CoV-2 in K-12 Schools and Early Care and Education Programs.
