Awareness is growing about the importance of the flu vaccination. Collaborations are building at a fast rate. 100+ partners have committed to the cause and are spreading the word about flu vaccination.

National Coalition on Black Civic Participation – Influenza "Tour" Topic Healthy, Wealthy, and Wise, a nationwide black empowerment tour, led by NCBCP, makes flu vaccination a top priority. Health events were held in Greenville, MS; Biloxi, MS; and Atlanta, GA. Walgreens administered free vaccinations in Atlanta. Underway: Birmingham, AL; Chicago, IL; Cleveland, OH; Detroit, MI; and New Orleans, LA.



Assembly of Petworth – Empowering Local Residents

The Assembly, a culturally diverse and multi-ethnic empowerment organization concerned about the quality of life in underserved communities in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area, is holding a press conference on December 2nd to address the prevalence of the flu among African Americans. Free flu vaccinations will be available.

Gearing up for a press conference and free vaccinations on December 5th, city officials and celebrities from the DC United soccer team alongside Hispanic leaders will be on hand to get vaccinated and promote flu vaccination.
