

SHELTER "I SPY"

Find and name objects around your hurricane shelter that match the clues—just like a scavenger hunt with your eyes!

What You'll Need:

- A safe space set up like a hurricane shelter
- A list of "I Spy" clues (make your own like the example below!)
- Optional: A clipboard or paper to check off items

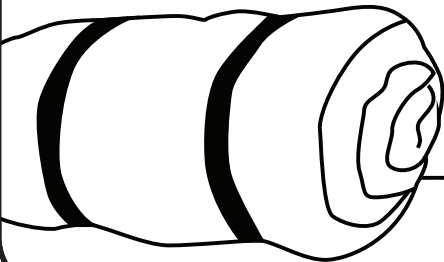
How to Play:

- 1 One person is the "Spy" and says, "I spy with my little eye something that..." and gives a clue about something they see in the shelter.
- 2 The other players look around and try to guess what the object is.
- 3 The first person to guess correctly gets to be the next Spy!
- 4 Keep playing until everyone has had a turn or all the items are found.

For example, the Spy might say...

"I spy with my little eye something cozy and soft, shaped like a long pouch, and you go inside of it."

The answer is a sleeping bag!




Tips for Extra Fun:

Use real items or pictures of shelter supplies.

Play in teams or pairs.

Add a timer for fast-paced rounds!






Sometimes, when there's a hurricane or another type of storm, you might need to go to a disaster shelter to stay safe.





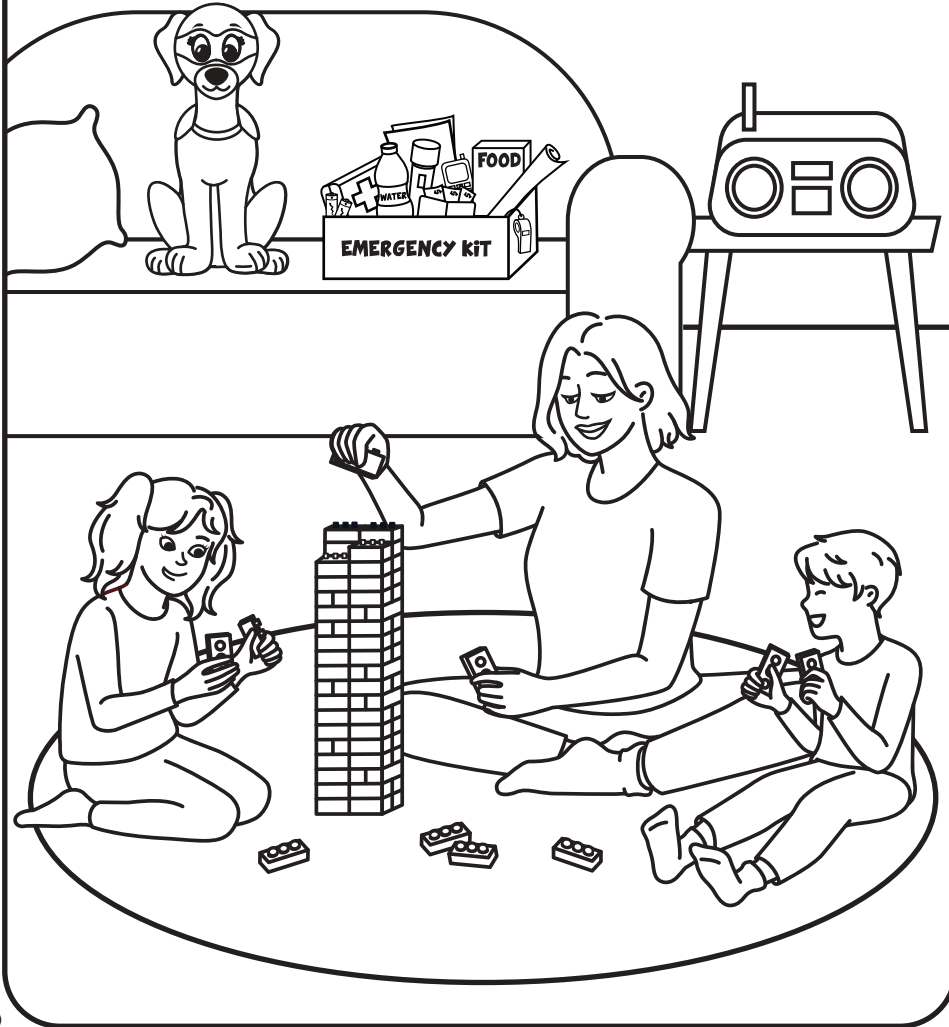
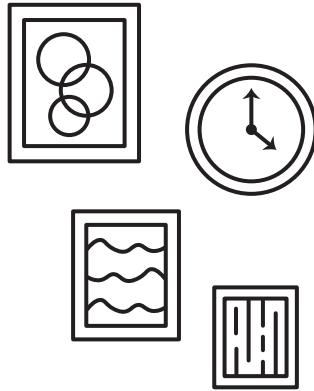
