Release of 2021 National Ambulatory Medical Care Survey (NAMCS) Health Center (HC) Component Linked to Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Housing Assistance Program Data

The National Center for Health Statistics' (NCHS) Data Linkage Program is pleased to announce that the 2021 National Ambulatory Medical Care Survey (NAMCS) Health Center (HC) Component has been linked with 2020-2022 housing assistance program data from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The NAMCS HC Component collects electronic health record (EHR) information for all patient visits occurring in participating federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) and FQHC lookalikes to describe patterns of health care delivery and utilization in health centers. The HUD administrative data provide information for participants of HUD's three largest federal housing assistance programs: Housing Choice Vouchers, Public Housing, and assisted Multifamily programs. The linkage of patient-level EHR information from the NAMCS HC Component with HUD administrative housing assistance program participation data creates a new data resource that can support a wide array of public health and policy evaluation studies focused on the role of housing assistance program participation as a key social determinant of health.
