Gender identity. All data about gender identity were collected before [Executive Order 14168](#) issued on January 20, 2025 that changed how federal departments could collect gender information. Experimental questions about gender identity were fielded in RANDS 9. RANDS 9 respondents were asked, "Are you female, male, transgender, non-binary, or another gender?" Respondents had the option to select one or more responses, and to provide the term they used to describe themselves if another gender. RANDS 9 respondents were also asked, "Please list some of the things that you associate with being [your gender]." This was an open-ended question for respondents to respond to in their own words. In compliance with the executive order (Exec. Order No. 14168, 2025) and OPM guidance (OPM Memo, 2025), these data are not available through the RDC.
