Up to Date Definition: Quarter 4 of 2024

Changes in Reporting Up to Date COVID-19 Vaccination Status

- Definition of up to date for NHSN surveillance changes over time!
- As a reminder, facilities should use the definitions outlined in the following document for each quarter: <u>COVID-19 Vaccination Modules: Understanding</u> Key Terms and Up to Date Vaccination

Approval of 2024-2025 Updated COVID-19 Vaccines

- The <u>U.S. Food and Drug Administration</u> (FDA) approved and authorized 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccines on August 22, 2024
- The 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccines were discontinued and replaced with the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccines
- CDC recommends that everyone aged 6 months and older receive the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccines
- Reporting changes for the updated definition begin the week of September 30, 2024 (Quarter 4 of 2024)

New Definition: Up to Date with COVID-19 Vaccines


Individuals are considered Up to Date with their COVID-19 vaccines during the NHSN surveillance period of September 30, 2024 – December 29, 2024, if they meet the following criteria:

Received a 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine*

Note: Users should review the <u>COVID-19 Vaccination Modules: Understanding Key Terms and Up to Date Vaccination</u> document at least once per quarter to check for definition updates.

^{*}Individuals are also considered up to date if they received a 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine within the past 2 months

Decision Tree for Quarter 4 of 2024



Reporting Up to Date COVID-19 Vaccination Status

 Under the new recommendations, most HCP will **not** be Up to Date with COVID-19 vaccines until they receive the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine

 HCP will become up to date as they receive the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine this Fall/Winter

• Facilities should report **zero (0)** up to date until HCP receive the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine (see example on next slide)

- Reporting requirements and frequency of data reporting have not changed
- Data collection form has not changed: <u>Healthcare</u> <u>Personnel COVID-19</u> <u>Vaccination Cumulative</u> <u>Summary (Form 57.219)</u> (cdc.gov)

Example #1: Healthcare Personnel

- Mary is a healthcare worker who received a dose of the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine on August 30, 2024.
 - Is Mary Up to Date with COVID-19 vaccination?

Example #1: Healthcare Personnel (cont.)

- Mary is a healthcare worker who received a dose of the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine on August 30, 2024.
 - Is Mary Up to Date with COVID-19 vaccination?
 - Yes, Mary is Up to Date because she received the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine
 - Mary should be counted in question #2 (Up to Date)

Example #2: Healthcare Personnel

- Sherene is a healthcare worker who received a dose of the 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine on August 15, 2024.
 - Is Sherene Up to Date with COVID-19 vaccination?

Example #2: Healthcare Personnel (cont.)

- Sherene is a healthcare worker who received a dose of the 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine on August 15, 2024.
 - Is Sherene Up to Date with COVID-19 vaccination?
 - Yes, Sherene is Up to Date because she received the 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine within the last two months
 - Sherene should be counted in question #2 (Up to Date)
 - Note: Sherene would need to receive the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine after October 15, 2024, to remain Up to Date

Example #3: Healthcare Personnel

- Carrie is a healthcare worker who has not received any prior COVID-19 vaccines. Carrie reported a medical contraindication that prevents her from receiving the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine.
 - Is Carrie Up to Date with COVID-19 vaccination?

Example #3: Healthcare Personnel (cont.)

- Carrie, is a healthcare worker who has not received any prior COVID-19 vaccines. Carrie reported a medical contraindication that prevents her from receiving the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine.
 - Is Carrie Up to Date with COVID-19 vaccination?
 - No, Carrie is not Up to Date because she has a medical contraindication that prevents her from receiving the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine
 - Carrie should be counted in question #3.1 (medical contraindication)

Example #4: Healthcare Personnel

- Robert is a healthcare worker who received a 2023-2024
 COVID-19 vaccine on May 1, 2024. He declined to receive the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine.
 - Is Robert Up to Date with COVID-19 vaccination?

Example #4: Healthcare Personnel (cont.)

- Robert is a healthcare worker who received a 2023-2024
 COVID-19 vaccine on May 1, 2024. He declined to receive the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine.
 - Is Robert Up to Date with COVID-19 vaccination?
 - No, Robert is not Up to Date because he received the 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine over two months ago and has declined the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine
 - Robert should be counted in question #3.2 (declined vaccination)

Example #5: Healthcare Personnel

- Amy is a healthcare worker who received a 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine on March 31, 2024. She has not received any other COVID-19 vaccines since then. She is planning to receive the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine but has not had the opportunity to do so.
 - Is Amy Up to Date with COVID-19 vaccination?

Example #5: Healthcare Personnel (cont.)

- Amy is a healthcare worker who received a 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine on March 31, 2024. She has not received any other COVID-19 vaccines since then. She is planning to receive the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine but has not had the opportunity to do so.
 - Is Amy Up to Date with COVID-19 vaccination?
 - No, Amy is not Up to Date because she received the 2023-2024
 COVID-19 vaccine over two months ago and has not received the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine
 - Amy should be counted in question #3.3 (unknown/other COVID-19 vaccination status) since she does not fall into any of the other categories

Updates to the Person-level COVID-19 Vaccination Form

Using the Person-level COVID-19 Vaccination Form

An optional tool that can be used to report data to the NHSN COVID-19
 Vaccination Module

 Data including vaccination dates for HCP are directly entered line by line in the optional Person-Level COVID-19 Vaccination Form or uploaded via a .CSV file

Makes reporting vaccination data easier and more efficient

It applies changes to the Up to Date NHSN surveillance definition for you!

Up to Date Definition Change and the Person-level COVID-19

Vaccination Form

- Users will be able to select the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine manufacturer **starting on September 30, 2024**
 - The corresponding dose date must be on or after September 2, 2024.
- If a healthcare worker receives the updated 2024-2025 COVID-19 vaccine before September 30, 2024, and you are entering data for weeks between September 2-29, 2024:
 - Select the 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine
 - On September 30, 2024, the NHSN application will be automatically updated to change these doses to the 2024-2025 updated COVID-19 vaccine, and these individuals will be counted as up to date

Additions to the Person-Level COVID-19 Vaccination Form

 Extra columns were added to the Person-level Vaccination Form to accommodate for additional vaccine doses (doses 8-10)

Dose 8 Date	Dose 8 Manufacturer	Dose 9 Date	Dose 9 Manufacturer	Dose 10 Date	Dose 10 Manufacturer

- Including additional columns for each dose:
 - NDC number
 - Lot number
 - Expiration date
- Example:
 - Dose 8 Date, Dose 8 manufacturer, Dose 8 NDC number, Dose 8 lot number, Dose 8 expiration date

Reminder on NHSN Timestamps

NHSN Timestamps

- As of February 26, 2024, timestamps for data submission and modification in the NHSN application were updated to display Coordinated Universal Time (UTC)
- UTC is the international time standard. It was implemented as part of ongoing NHSN system upgrades and modernization efforts
- The new UTC timestamp will have no impact on data submission deadlines
 - Local time remains in place for data submission deadlines
 - No action is needed from NHSN users




