

Naloxone is a medication that can reverse an opioid overdose, if given in time. It even works on drugs that may be mixed or laced with fentanyl. Your workplace may have naloxone in its first-aid kit. Ask your manager for training if you don't know how to use it.

If a customer or co-worker experiences an opioid overdose, it's important to know what to do: call 911 right away, use naloxone and stay with them until help arrives.

You could save a life.





Do you know the signs of overdose?

- Small, constricted "pinpoint pupils"
- Falling asleep or losing consciousness
- Slow, weak, or shallow breathing
- Choking or gurgling sounds
- Limp body
- Cold, clammy, and/or discolored skin
