

NALOXONE SAVES LIVES



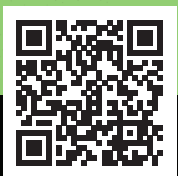
Naloxone is a non-addictive, life-saving medication that can reverse an overdose from opioids, including fentanyl. It's small enough to fit into a pocket or small bag.

If you or someone you know uses opioids or drugs that contain opioids (like fentanyl), ask your healthcare provider or pharmacist about prescribing naloxone. You may also be able to get it from your local or state health department or an overdose prevention program for free or at a reduced cost.



Substance use disorders are treatable diseases, and many treatment options are available, including medications for opioid use disorder.
