PHEP Recipient Call to Be Held September 18



# **Emergency Response Activities**

## **CDC Updates New Oropouche Response Resources**

CDC is now able to provide clinical diagnostic testing for patients with suspected acute Oropouche virus disease in addition to a previously available neutralization test. This testing consists of clinical laboratory improvement amendment (CLIA)-validated molecular and neutralizing antibody testing of serum or cerebrospinal fluid.

All specimens must be submitted to CDC through state health departments, following <u>CDC's routine arboviral testing submission protocol</u>. CDC will send the results to the health departments fore shareing with physicians for clinical decision making.

In addition, CDC has released <u>comprehensive guidance</u> for more rapid response to imported cases of Oropouche to reduce disease transmission. The new guidance is based on currently available knowledge about Oropouche virus disease, its transmission, and its possible effects on pregnant persons and infants.

Lastly, CDC published <u>Ask Dr. Dana</u>, where Dr. Dana Meaney-Delman, a CDC obstetrician/gynecologist, answers questions about the Oropouche outbreak.

## New CDC Vital Signs Report: Suicide Risk is Tied to Local Economic and Social Conditions

Certain community-level factors are associated with lower suicide rates, according to the latest CDC <u>Vital Signs</u> report. Suicide rates are lower in counties with more health insurance coverage, broadband internet access, and household income. This latest *Vital Signs* also explores the association of these three factors with suicide rates overall and what these relationships look like in groups most affected by suicide-- all to help inform suicide prevention programs in communities across the country.

## **DSLR Staff Author Recent MMWR Report on Mpox Contact Tracing**

DSLR staff were lead authors of a September 5 MMWR report, "Contact Tracing for Mpox Clade II Cases Associated with Air Travel — United States, July 2021–August 2022." Before 2021, limited information was available to assess mpox virus transmission risk aboard commercial aircraft. During 2021-2022, 113 persons traveled on commercial flights while they were infectious with clade II mpox. Among 1,046 traveler contacts followed by U.S. public health agencies, CDC identified no secondary cases. These findings indicate that traveling on a flight with a person with mpox does not appear to constitute an exposure risk or warrant routine contact tracing activities.

## September 19 COCA Call Provides New Lyme Disease Clinical Tools and Resources

CDC and the American Medical Association have developed a new toolkit to help clinicians provide better care for patients with prolonged, nonspecific symptoms and concerns about Lyme disease. CDC's Clinician Outreach and Communication Activity (COCA) will share these new clinical tools and resources during a call that will be held at **2 p.m. EDT on Thursday**, **September 19**. During this call, presenters will also provide a brief overview of Lyme disease and a diagnostic and management framework for patients with Lyme disease.
