September 11 PHEP Connects Webinar Addresses Enhancing Response and Recovery Coordination in Rural, Frontier, and Tribal Communities



CDC's next PHEP Connects webinar, "Enhancing Response and Recovery Coordination in Rural, Frontier, and Tribal Communities," is scheduled for **1 p.m. EDT on Wednesday, September 11**. The presenters below will share insights from real-life scenarios and actionable steps to improve coordination in rural and frontier communities.

Rick Tull from the Texas Department of State Health Services will discuss challenges and solutions in coordinating response and recovery efforts in rural and frontier communities. These efforts include addressing wildfires, tornadoes, and vector control threats.

Keira Wickliffe Berger from DSLR's Capacity Building and Technical Assistance Development Branch will address rural, frontier, and tribal coordination in the context of the PHEP exercise framework. Lastly, Lynda

Zambrano of the National Tribal Emergency Management Council and the Northwest Tribal Emergency Management Council will present examples and strategies to enhance coordination with tribal communities. Following is the participant information.


CDC Schedules Office Hours Session for PHEP BP1 CoA Response Workbooks

CDC Study Shows Early Flu Antiviral Treatment Decreases Risk of Death

Pneumonia is common in adults hospitalized with laboratory-confirmed influenza, but the association between timelines of influenza antiviral treatment and severe clinical outcomes in patients with influenza-associated pneumonia is not well characterized. This <u>CDC study</u>, published in the journal Clinical Infectious Diseases, suggests starting antiviral drug treatment early reduces death in adults hospitalized with flu.

Participants will also hear from representatives of different U.S. Department of Health and Human Services regions who will share their experiences and best practices for implementing the NSPS in their regions.
