

Signs or Symptoms

A patient or resident with sepsis might have one or more of the following signs or symptoms:



Clammy or sweaty skin



High heart rate or low blood pressure



Extreme pain or discomfort



New onset or increased confusion or disorientation



Fever, shivering, or feeling very cold



Shortness of breath

Gather the following information for the patients you are caring for and communicate it to hospital healthcare professionals, in addition to telling them you suspect sepsis:

- Medications
- Allergies
- Pre-existing conditions
- Other risk factors for sepsis
