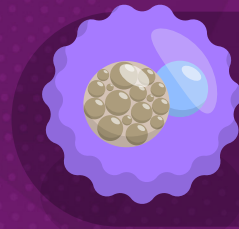




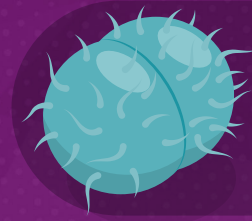

The State of STIs in the United States in 2023.

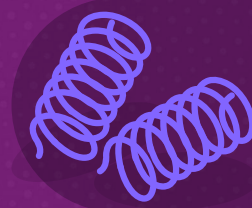
Sexually transmitted infections (STIs) are very common but preventable.



1.6 million cases of **CHLAMYDIA**; **9% decrease** since 2019.



601,319 cases of **GONORRHEA**; **2% decrease** since 2019.



209,253 cases of **SYPHILIS**; **61% increase** since 2019.



3,882 cases of **SYPHILIS AMONG NEWBORNS**; **106% increase** since 2019.



Anyone who has sex could get an STI, **but some groups are more affected:**

- ✓ young people aged 15-24
- ✓ gay & bisexual men
- ✓ pregnant people
- ✓ racial & ethnic minority groups

Untreated STIs can lead to **serious health problems:**



increased risk of transmitting or getting HIV



long-term pelvic/abdominal pain



inability to get pregnant or pregnancy complications
