Sexually transmitted infections (STIs) are very common but preventable.



1.6 million cases of CHLAMYDIA; 9% decrease since 2019.





601,319 cases of GONORRHEA; 2% decrease since 2019.





209,253 cases of SYPHILIS; 61% increase since 2019





3,882
cases of SYPHILIS
AMONG NEWBORNS;
106% increase since 2019.

Anyone who has sex could get an STI, but some groups are more affected:

- young people aged 15-24
- gay & bisexual men
- Ø pregnant people
- **⊘** racial & ethnic minority groups

Untreated STIs can lead to serious health problems:



increased risk of transmitting or getting HIV



long-term pelvic/abdominal pain



inability to get pregnant or pregnancy complications
